



UCF offers Graduate RAMP Fellowships to provide financial support to the most outstanding undergraduate RAMP students who continue into UCF graduate programs. In addition to tuition and health insurance coverage, this fellowship pays a yearly stipend of \$10,000 for two years for master's students and \$12,000 for four years for doctoral students. Award recipients are selected in spring by the UCF Diversity Fellowship Committee for awards beginning the following fall term. Students may apply by completing a Graduate RAMP Fellowship application (attached, or available at graduate.ucf.edu/fellowships/).

Duration of Award:

Maximum of two years of support for master's students.

Maximum of four years of support for doctoral students.

Yearly Fellowship Stipend:

\$10,000 master's; \$12,000 doctoral (paid in fall and spring semesters)

Tuition Support:

UCF College of Graduate Studies pays the tuition charges for degree program courses during each year of the award. The student is responsible for the payment of fees (health fee, athletic fee, building fee, etc.).

Health Insurance:

A UCF Student Health Insurance Policy through UnitedHealthcare and serviced by Gallagher Student Health & Special Risk will be provided for your individual coverage for the duration of the award.

Eligibility and Selection Criteria:

- Admission to a UCF graduate program requiring independent research or scholarly work. Preference will be given to those students entering UCF doctoral programs.
- Successful completion of the RAMP undergraduate program, including attendance at all RAMP program workshops and activities and participation in the Showcase of Undergraduate Research Excellence (SURE).
- Excellent academic standing.
- A highly competitive GRE score for your program.
- Full-time enrollment in an eligible graduate program is required. Please see the Financial Information section of the current Graduate Catalog for more information.

Fellowship Obligations:

- Maintain good academic standing and acceptable progress to degree.
- Participate in the Graduate Research Forum.
- Participate in the diversity fellowship community and RAMP program activities.
- Maintain full-time enrollment in your graduate degree program (9 credit hours are required during the fall and spring semesters). Summer enrollment is optional - fellowship recipients receive tuition support for 6 credit hours during the summer semesters if enrolled full-time.

- Personal statement addressing the following:
 - Your goals for pursuing graduate study.
 - How your research will contribute to your educational aspirations.
 - How your background, experiences, and achievements will contribute to UCF's goal of promoting excellence through diversity.
- Two letters of reference, including one from your undergraduate RAMP faculty mentor.
- Resumé

UCF Graduate RAMP Fellowship Application

The UCF Graduate RAMP Fellowship is a competitive fellowship that is offered to the most outstanding undergraduate RAMP students who are accepted into UCF graduate programs.

Duration of Award: Maximum of two years of support for master’s students. Maximum of four years of support for doctoral students.

Fellowship Stipend: \$10,000 per year for master’s students; \$12,000 per year for doctoral students.

Tuition Support: UCF College of Graduate Studies pays the tuition charges for degree program courses during each year of the award. The student is responsible for the payment of fees (health fee, athletic fee, building fee, etc.).

Health Insurance: A UCF Student Health Insurance Policy through UnitedHealthcare and serviced by Gallagher Student Health & Special Risk will be provided for your individual coverage for the duration of the award.

If you submitted your personal statement, resume, and reference letters that meet the criteria below as part of your admissions application, you are not required to include them with this application. A complete admissions application must be submitted by the priority deadline, January 15, to be considered for this fellowship.

- Personal statement addressing the following:
• Your goals for pursuing graduate study
• How your research will contribute to your educational aspirations
• How your background, experiences, and achievements will contribute to UCF’s goal of promoting excellence through diversity
• Two letters of reference, including one from your undergraduate RAMP faculty mentor.
• Resumé - highlighting professional and academic achievements.
