GRADUATE STUDENT CENTER

The Graduate Student Center is your space—a welcoming community where graduate students gather and connect. It's a place for workshops, presentations, academic events, and collaborations, Study, exchange ideas, and connect with peers who share your journey. On the second floor of the Trevor Colbourn Hall Building, the Graduate Student Center offers four main areas; study rooms, a multipurpose room, a presentation room, and a conference room equipped with advanced technologies.



SCHOOL OF VISUAL ARTS AND DESIGN

The School of Visual Arts and Design is where the seeing, thinking, hearing, touching, learning, and creating thrive. A diverse set of graduate programs and courses cater to artists and designers of

all varieties, offering specialized tracks and concentrations that suit your artistic and professional goals.



MEMORY MALL

This expansive grassy area – located between the Addition Financial Arena, FAIRWINDS Alumni Center, and the Student Union. On game days, UCF football fans gather here to tailgate and celebrate before kickoff. Nearby Knights

Plaza boasts an array of restaurants and retail shops, including Barnes & Noble, an Amazon Hub Locker, and Knightro's - one of two on-campus dining halls.



COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING AND COMPUTER SCIENCE

Housed in three buildings, the College of Engineering and Computer Science is where students work with industry leaders such as Lockheed Martin, Boeing, Harris Corp., NASA, and Siemens. Cutting-edge nanotechnology research happens here

in the Advanced Materials Processing and Analysis Center. In the atrium of Engineering II, take a peek through the glass walls of the Idea Lab, then scope out the replica ride vehicle from Walt Disney World's Space Mountain.



COLLEGE OF BUSINESS

Home to some of UCF's top graduate programs, the College of Business offers a variety of graduate programs with various schedules and location options designed to accommodate both full-time and parttime graduate students.



STUDENT UNION

The heart of the UCF campus is a hub for activities, events, and socializing. Eateries include Panda Express, Steak 'n Shake, Smoothie King, Starbucks, and more. There are study spaces and computer labs with free printing, a computer store,

lounges, a convenience store, and the SGA Ticket Center, which offers student discounts to local attractions and events.



JOHN T. WASHINGTON CENTER

Located adjacent to the library and the Student Union, the John T. Washington Center, named for one of the first Black faculty members at UCF, features a mural of him and his contributions to campus. This gathering place – also referred to as

the breezeway — includes UCF Card Services, a barber shop, a campus bookstore, Chick-fil-A, Domino's Pizza, and services for banking, mailing, and printing.

JOHN C. HITT LIBRARY



The John C. Hitt Library offers a variety of space options for students; individual and faculty/graduate student study rooms; a presentation practice room; two library classrooms: quiet study floors: Infusion Café:

Knowledge Commons (24,800 square foot learning and technology environment providing seating for 479 students) and a variety of exhibit spaces on the 2nd and 5th floors.



REFLECTING POND/MILLICAN HALL

A popular spot to study and socialize -the Reflecting Pond is a campus landmark between the John C. Hitt Library and Millican Hall. During Homecoming Week, UCF hosts Spirit Splash, a wet and wild pep rally, where Knights rush into the

Reflecting Pond; for a chance to catch the year's signature rubber duck. Millican Hall is recognized as one of the oldest buildings on campus and remains a central location of the university's administrative work. Included are the offices of the College of Graduate Studies, Academic Affairs, Student Accounts, Financial Aid, and many others.

services to enrolled students.




RECREATION AND WELLNESS CENTER

STUDY ROOMS

The Study Rooms provide students with a dedicated quiet space for studying or collaborating. One of the rooms features computer workstations equipped with specialized software for statistical analyses, creating publication-quality

figures, and other essential tools. These resources support graduate students in their studies and facilitate the process of conducting and presenting their research.



CONFERENCE ROOM

The Conference Room allows graduate students to reserve a space for various activities for academic or professional purposes. It is a comfortable environment for conducting scholarly work, collaborative study sessions, or professional meetings.

The room has advanced technology, which enhances functionality and facilitates seamless interactions.
