As with all concentrations, the courses listed below are suggestions. You may take other courses as they pertain to your goals and interests. However, if you substitute courses, your degree might not qualify as online-only, and you will not earn the certificate. Certificate programs do not allow substitutions.

You may take no more than FIVE courses in a single college or discipline unless specifically approved by your advisor. If you want to earn the certificates, you must apply to each certificate program as well as the MA/MS IDS, and you will be responsible for ensuring you complete all certificate and master’s degree requirements as shown in the catalog and handbooks. Highlighted courses may be substituted for the IDS core **research** course if approved. Courses in **red** may be used for both certificates. Nearly all courses will count for critical thinking/writing.
